Bill Summary



IMPACT TO RARE DISEASE

Patients with rare diseases often face significantly higher healthcare costs, and many rely on **copay assistance programs** to afford their life-saving medications.

However, many insurers and Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs) currently use practices that prevent these third-party payments from counting toward a patient's deductible or out-of-pocket maximum.

This practice, known as a **copay accumulator**, can force patients to pay thousands of dollars after their assistance runs out, making it difficult to afford and adhere to their prescribed treatments.

WHAT IS THIS BILL ABOUT?

This bill protects patients from harmful pharmacy benefit manager (PBM) practices and makes sure copay assistance counts toward deductibles and out-of-pocket maximums.

Named for Cole Schmidtknecht, who lost his life after being unable to afford his medication, the bill **bans copay accumulator programs,** stops unfair PBM fees, requires fair reimbursement, and protects patient choice.

Over 20 states have already passed similar protections, this bill would bring these protections to Wisconsin.
